REPORT ON THE BLOOD DONATION CAMP

A Blood Donation Camp was organized on 10 August, 2025 at D.A.V. Public School, Velachery, Chennai in collaboration with Rotary Club Madras East (RCME) and V.H.S Tharamani, Chennai.

The camp was organised in commemoration of 'Shravani Parv and Ved Prachar Saptah', a week long programme dedicated to Social initiatives for Community Outreach.

The School aimed to connect to the community and help patients in need, dispel myths surrounding blood donation and encourage community participation and volunteerism.

Thiru. P. Manimaran, M.A., M.C., Councillor, Ward 177 - Velachery and Treasurer, Greater Chennai Corporation inaugurated the Blood Donation Camp and applauded all the Volunteers and Donors for their initiative and altruism.

Some potential donors had to be deferred due to low haemoglobin levels, medication, or other health issues.

A total of **55 units** (**both 450 and 350ml**) of blood were collected during the event. The Health Care Team from V.H.S. informed donors about the importance of blood donation, the donation process, and post-donation care.

The blood donation camp was a success, with the remarkable number of units collected and a positive response from the community. One Parent said, "We are happy to reconnect with the School through such programmes". An Alumnus added, "The School giving back to the Community through the Community is a beautiful idea." The medical staff from VHS was overwhelmed by the responses in the half-day camp. The event not only helped collect much-needed blood but also raised awareness about the importance of blood donation.

Refreshments were sponsored by the Host School and the VHS Blood Bank and Certificates were issued to all the Donors.

It was endearing to witness the Community Engagement along with RCME and VHS to promote blood donation and create a culture of volunteerism.
